## **Red Flags**

- **Scripted Answers**
- Does not possess own ID or cell phone, or has multiple
- Limited eve contact
- Appears to be afraid
- Various hotel keys / receipts from other states
- Signs of physical abuse
- Uses terms of the trade, like daddy, track, blade, date
- Tattoos or "brands"
- Homelessness
- Outward signs of drug addiction
- Under 18 (current or past DCFS placement; runaway 3+; unexplained truancies)
- Has a significantly older "boyfriend" or "girlfriend"
